**WHEREAS, school reading programs provide students with a chance to improve their reading skills and take pleasure in stories; and**

**WHEREAS, , such programs have a profound and lasting positive impact on a child's life through improved reading comprehension, motivation, and achievement, as well as improved overall academic performance, classroom behavior, self-confidence, and social skills; and**

**WHEREAS, all people of the United States can help celebrate the importance of reading by donating children's books, volunteering to read to and mentor young students, and supporting public policies aimed at improving literacy rates.**

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the City Council of the City of Ypsilanti designate March as Reading Month and encourage all residents to expose community youth to literature.**

**WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has hit the City of Ypsilanti and our businesses extremely hard; and**

**WHEREAS, public health guidance indicates that outdoor dining is safer than indoor dining and consumers preferred these outdoor spaces in 2020; and**

**WHEREAS, the city seeks to assist in the recovery of our small businesses and help encourage best practices that support our local economy; and**

**WHEREAS, the unique conditions of Downtown and its stakeholders offers an opportunity for a longer street closure; and**

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Ypsilanti City Council amends the special event permit closing North Washington Street from Pearl to Michigan Avenue from April 1, 2021 until November 1, 2021. **RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF YPSILANTI:**

**WHEREAS, Public Act 20 of 1943, MCLA 129.91, et seq, as amended ("Public Act 20"), authorizes the Local Unit to invest surplus funds in certain permissible investments; and**

**WHEREAS, the Surplus Funds Investment Pool Act, Act No. 367 of the Public Acts of 1982, MCL 129.11, et seq, as amended, authorizes political subdivisions organized under the laws of the State of Michigan, including counties, cities, villages, townships, school districts**

**and other authorities (collectively "Political Subdivisions") to invest surplus funds in certain investment pools; and**

**WHEREAS, the Urban Cooperation Act of 1967, 1967 PA 4, Ex, Sess. No. 7, MCLA 124.501, et seq., as amended, provides that two or more Political Subdivisions may jointly cooperate in the exercise or in the performance of their respective governmental functions, powers or responsibilities and may enter into such joint agreements as may be deemed appropriate for such purposes when such agreements have been adopted by all such cooperating Political Subdivisions; and**

**WHEREAS, the Declaration of Trust (Interlocal Agreement), as amended, and an Information Statement relating to the Michigan Liquid Asset Fund Plus (the "Fund") have been presented to this council; and**

**WHEREAS, the Declaration of Trust, as amended, authorizes Political Subdivisions to adopt and enter into the Declaration of Trust and become participants of the Fund; and**

**WHEREAS, this Council deems it advisable for the Local Unit to adopt and enter into the Declaration of Trust and become a participant of the Fund for the purpose of the joint investment of the Local Unit's money and those of other Political Subdivisions so as to enhance the investment earnings accruing to each Political Subdivisions.**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:**

- 1. The Local Unit shall join with other Political Subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of Public Act 20, the Surplus Funds Investment Pool Act and the Urban Cooperation Act of 1967, as such laws are applicable, by becoming a participant of a Fund in entering into the Declaration of Trust, which Declaration of Trust is adopted by reference thereto with the same effect as if it had been set out verbatim in this resolution. A copy of the Declaration of Trust shall be filed with the minutes of the meeting at which this resolution was adopted.**
- 2. The Local Unit is hereby authorized to invest its available funds from time to time and to withdraw such funds from time to time in accordance with the provisions of the Declaration of Trust. The following officers and officials of the Local Unit are authorized to take such actions and execute any and all such documents as they may deem necessary and appropriate to effectuate the entry by the Local Unit into the Declaration of Trust and the adoption thereof by the Local Unit.**

**Whereas, the Center for Disease Control has advised that wearing a mask and keeping socially distance will help stop the spread of COVID-19; and**

**Whereas, Washtenaw County reported 633 new cases of COVID-19 the week of March 4, 2021, with 125 of those diagnosis being in the 48197 and 48198 Zip Codes; and**

**Whereas, the Michigan Legislature and Governor have amended the Open Meetings Act to allow for no reason virtual meetings until March 31, 2021; and**

**Whereas, upon its expiration public bodies throughout the state will be forced to begin meeting in person, creating a risk to public health; and**
